The papers should be submitted electronically before January 30, 2012 Extended to February 13, 2012, through the EasyChair system. The papers should be prepared following the instructions from Springer LNCS series. (see format of LNCS/LNAI Series)

Submission implies the willingness of at least one of the authors to register and to present the communication at the conference, if it is accepted.

General Information.

Huatulco (wa-TULE-co) is a developing resort area in Mexico, in the state of Oaxaca, located 425 miles southeast of Acapulco.

The Oaxacan coastline, with average water temperatures of 28°C (that's 82.4 degrees Fahrenheit!) and clear days nearly all year round, has azure blue waters, fine white sand and an unusual landscape that creates privacy and gives each one of the nine bays a distinct personality:

- Conejos
- Tangolunda
- Chahue
- Santa Cruz
- Maguey
- Organo
- Cacaluta
- Chahacual
- San Agustin

In the background the gray-blue mountains of the Sierra Madre del Sur frames the bays. Less than half of Huatulco's bays have been developed so far, making it less popular than other lively resort places in Mexico such as Cancun, Cabo San Lucas, Puerto Vallarta and Ixtapa. On the other hand, you will have the chance to visit beautiful undeveloped bays and beaches avoiding the dense crowds found in other places.

Money.

The Mexican currency is the peso (\$). The present <u>exchange rate</u> with the U.S. dollar is about \$13.50 = 1.0USD. Many local stores and branch banks do not accept foreign traveler's checks, U.S. dollars, or credit cards. Foreign credit cards are accepted in major restaurants, stores, and hotels. Best exchange rates are found in CASAS de CAMBIO (exchange houses). Most banks open only on weekdays, also from 9 am to 5 pm. USA cash or travelers checks are easier to change into pesos than other types of currency.

Weather.

Huatulco has almost 300 days of sunshine per year. The climate is warm semi-humid with a year round temperature of 82 degrees F. The weather in Huatulco during the summer months can reach over 100 degrees F. June through September is known as the rainy season; nevertheless Huatulco only averages around 40 rain days a year. September is the wettest month, humidity is high as temps average mid-80s.

Language.

Spanish is the official language in Mexico. But in Huatulco several people speak English. However, we advise you to have a good dictionary and a phrasebook when you venture out.
